












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Background

Aims

- i) To audit practice guideline standards for placement offers and practice educator training
- ii) To review the potential barriers to offering practice placements
- iii) To identify areas for quality improvement projects











Methodology

- Retrospective data: placement offers for academic year 2017-2018
- Databases:
 - Occupational therapy student database
 - Physiotherapy student database
 - Occupational therapy practice educator database
 - Physiotherapy practice educator database
- Practice educator questionnaire















Results

	Audit standard	Result (%)	Total audited (n)
1	Band 7 physiotherapists to offer one placement per therapist per academic year	94	36
2	Band 6 physiotherapists to offer two placements per therapist per academic year	94	61
3	Band 6 and Band 7 occupational therapists to offer 1 placement per therapist per academic year	100	51
4	All Band 6 and Band 7 to complete the practice educator training	98	154
5	All practice educator to attend a practice educator update every 2 years	61	151








