Louise Younie (MBChB, MRCGP (dist), MSc (dist), EdD, PFHEA, NTF) is a General Practitioner and Professor of Medical Education at Queen Mary University of London where she leads on faculty development, innovation and flourishing. She has extensive experience with creative enquiry methodologies in medical education for humanising medicine, professional identity formation and human flourishing. She is also co-lead for our co-creation student recognition SEED award. She is co-chair of the Royal College of GPs Creative Health Special Interest Group (SIG). She holds a Principal Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy and has recently been awarded a National Teaching Fellow in recognition of this work (2022).

Overview Keynote

Discussing flourishing shifts the wellbeing dialogue from mere resilience and "toughing it out" towards something deeper—an interconnected, ecological perspective that ties our inner lives to the natural cycles of loss and renewal, death and growth. Flourishing embodies our connection to values, purpose, and meaning (Aristotle's eudaimonia), fostering a compassionate engagement with both our humanity and that of others.

Louise will share her own research and practice to emphasise the importance of creative enquiry—exploring lived experience through the arts—and co-creation, where students and educators collaborate to enrich learning spaces and experiences. These



approaches create environments that nurture and sustain human flourishing. Delegates will be prompted to think about creative enquiry and co-creative methodologies to transform pedagogical practices at the front line
